Albion in the Community uses the power of football to help improve the health and wellbeing of local people - from football sessions encouraging children to get active and health projects supporting people living beyond cancer, to football sessions helping children and adults with a disability participate in sport. By wearing blue and white you're helping to change the lives of local people across Sussex.

SUPPORTING CHILDREN WITH A DISABILITY

Chase is nine years old and has always dreamt of being a footballer. But Chase has cerebral palsy, a condition which affects muscle control and movement and impacts one in every 400 children.

He attends our football session for people who have cerebral palsy or use a frame. It gives children who are often excluded from playing the opportunity to get active.

Being part of these sessions provides important exercise and fitness which helps stretch Chase's muscles and support his movement.



WEAR BLUE AND WHITE TO CHANGE LIVES

PEOPLE RECOVERING FROM CANCER



Ken has been following Brighton & Hove Albion home and away for 50 years. Ken, however, has also become a regular at our free health programme which supports people during and after cancer treatment.

The benefits of staying active during cancer treatment include reducing fatigue and a decreased risk of disease progression and recurrence. For Ken, the support provided by the group setting has been just as important.

"Everyone encourages each other. It has helped my mood and I'm more active. The coaches are fantastic and I look forward to it every single week."

YOUNG PEOPLE ACHIEVING THEIR POTENTIAL



We work with 148 schools – using football-themed lessons to help hundreds of young people improve their learning and academic achievement.

Cadogan is a fantastic example of why that work is so important.

His dad explained:

"He only had a certain amount of friends at school and he would only do certain things. Now I can't express enough what a different child he is. When he is happy he communicates and he interacts with everybody and that's all down to the school and down to working with AITC – it's fantastic. It has changed his life."

HOW YOUR BLUE AND WHITE MAKES A DIFFERENCE

£25

could help pay for personal development workshops for young people, tackling issues such as drugs, alcohol or homophobia.



£55

could help buy specialist footballs for children who are blind or visually impaired.



£120

could help pay for a qualified football coach to support children with a disability to participate in our sessions and get active.



£300
